

Formal Requirements for Articles in the Berg- und Hüttenmännische Monatshefte (BHM)

To help us with the review process, please observe the following guidelines for your article.

Document

You can save your contribution as a Word document or as a LaTeX document. If you use LaTeX, please use the Springer Nature LaTeX authoring template available from <https://www.springernature.com/gp/authors/campaigns/latex-author-support>. Please send the original source file (including all your style files and figures) and a PDF version of the compiled LaTeX file.

You should divide your text into hierarchically numbered sub-chapters, but you do not need to use a special format for your contribution and you can leave your figures and tables embedded in the text.

You can write your article in German or in English. The length of your article should not exceed 3000 words including the list of references.

Necessary parts of your contribution

All contributions in Berg- and Hüttenmännische Monatshefte are published with the title, abstract, and keywords in both English and German, which is why we are asking for the title, abstract, and keywords in both languages. You may add acknowledgements, if any, at the end of your article.

For your contribution, we would need all the following details in your contribution. Please check that you have the following information on the first page of your contribution:

- Title of the article (German and English)
- All authors (please write their first names in full)
- Affiliation of all authors (company or university, including city and country)
- Corresponding author: name, postal address, email address (please see note below)
- Abstract (German and English)
- Keywords (German and English)

Corresponding author

If you have a university affiliation or that of a research institution, use these details as your contact details because you may then qualify for free open access publishing.

Please check here if your university/research institution is included:

Any free open access arrangements (via university/research institution) apply only to the corresponding author and cannot be handled by any of the other co-authors.

You can, of course, select a co-author as corresponding author if that co-author qualifies for the open access agreement via their university/research institution.

References

All your references are processed automatically by Springer in the style "Springer - MathPhys (numeric, brackets)". To make the process easier, we are asking you to refer to your sources in numerical style in square brackets ([1], [2], [3], etc.) in your text and provide all the necessary information in the list of references.

While the final formatting is done automatically, you should make sure that you have the following information complete, depending on the type of reference (book, journal, or internet page):

- For books: author(s), title, year, publisher, place of publication
- For journals: additionally volume number, issue number, and exact page references, DOI (if available)
- For internet pages: url and date of access

In case you are using a reference manager like Zotero or Mendeley, you can switch the style to "Springer - MathPhys (numeric, brackets)" for your references. The common reference managers have this style available in their style repositories.

For LaTeX documents, the bibliography style file sn-basic.bst is available in the Springer Nature LaTeX authoring template <https://www.springernature.com/gp/authors/campaigns/latex-author-support>.

Figures and tables

If your contribution includes figures and tables, please check the following information:

- You should refer to your figures and tables in the text as they are hyperlinked in the online version.
- You can use figures in colour as they appear online in colour and are also printed in colour.
- You should provide your figures in print quality. Please check that the resolution of the figures is at least 300dpi.
- For LaTeX documents, please use the .eps file format for your figures.

Publication process

After your contribution has been accepted, it will be handed over to the copy-editor of Berg- and Hüttenmännische Monatshefte. The copy-editor will be in touch with you about the necessary preparations for the publication of your contribution: checking if your contribution is complete, preparing your manuscript for publication, and forwarding your manuscript to Springer.
